Please note that the Illinois Cares Rx program will end on July 1, 2012.

Beginning July 1, 2012, many seniors will no longer receive help paying for their

prescription drugs and their Medicare Part D premiums. Seniors who are affected

have already begun receiving letters in the mail. Aging Care Connections realizes the

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impact this change will have on many seniors. For concerns about drug coverage, please make appointment at our offices or at one of the Benefit Stations in your community. Our staff and volunteers will attempt to work with each senior to determine what options may exist and to help evaluate Part D plans.
