



Position: Social Worker, Ambulatory Integration of the Medical and Social (AIMS) Program

Primary Function: To implement the AIMS Model of social work intervention at the BEDS Plus Summit Service Center, a fixed site, interim housing center for medically vulnerable homeless older adults. The intervention model includes a five-step process: patient engagement, assessment and care plan development, in person and/or telephonic case management, goal attainment and ongoing care.

Position Goals:

1. As a part of a Retirement Research Foundation grant, development and integration of practice process and protocols that foster medical and social work integration in the care of medically vulnerable, chronically homeless older adults that seeks to address determinants of health and improve patient outcomes.
2. Primary responsibility for onsite patient engagement, assessment of biopsychosocial and functional needs; follow up/risk focused intervention using the AIMS tools, Medicare Wellness assessment and/or other assessment tools appropriate to the patients' identified needs.
3. Responsible for conducting all follow up with patients as needs are identified through the assessment process.
4. Documentation of assessment and follow up activities in accordance with AIMS model practice protocols.
5. Compilation of grant data for grant reporting and agency database tracking.
6. Work collaboratively with grant partners BEDS Plus and Pillars Community Health on patient care and act as the primary contact/representative for Aging Care Connections in the partnership ensuring timely and professional communication and follow up.
7. Reports directly to the Transitional Care Supervisor and/or Director of Social Services
8. Complete all other tasks as assigned.

Qualifications:

Master of Social Work degree

Ability to sit for the LCSW exam

Minimum of two years experience in a social service setting
